



Hunmanby Heritage Open Days: Saturday 9th September 2023

All In the heart of the village, except the railway station and Bowling Club

Wrangham House, Stonegate: Local History Group Display: 10am to 1pm

A Grade II listed Georgian house. The Local History Group will be having a photographic exhibition "Women of Hunmanby." Where there will be photographs and information. The Local History Group will also have a display of 19th Century Fashion.

Community Centre, Stonegate: Parish Archive/Pop-up Museum, 10am-2pm

Wide-ranging display of documents, photographs, plans and maps from Parish Archive plus annual potato challenge weigh-in for Hunmanby Garden Association until 1pm.

Lock-Up and Pinfold: Junction of Stonegate-Sheepdyke Lane 10am-2pm

An opportunity to go inside a tiny early 19th Century red-brick temporary prison. Adjacent is a stone Pinfold, once used to impound stray animals. 12-2pm local born resident Godfrey Allanson will be welcome host, passionate about local history, a councillor for 45 years, and an Alderman for Scarborough & North Yorkshire Councils.

All Saints Church: Church Hill, 10am to 3pm

Large medieval mother church for surrounding villages of Norman origin, mentioned in the Domesday Book. Come and explore the 17th-century altar rail, hatchments, and monument of the Osbaldiston family, who were the 18th century lords of the manor.

Spring Café: 'A building's use through time' 4 Stonegate, 10am to 3pm

From the 1st village school built by the Lord of the Manor for his estate village to Community Cafe and Hunmanby Wellbeing Hub. A chance to meet and talk about Hunmanby's local history in this community café, enhanced with a display by the North Yorkshire County Council Outreach Librarian with old school records, photos and maps.

Hunmanby Village Heritage Walk starts 2pm at the War Memorial, Cross Hill

Join us for a guided walk around the village with George Sheeran our local expert identifying historic buildings in the village.

The White Swan Inn Exhibition: Cross Hill, all day from 11am

The White Swan buildings date from the 19th century, as a coaching inn, and village courthouse. Friends of the White Swan who have raised over £7,600 for local community groups, have helped the local landlord, Andy put on today's display.

Hunmanby Railway Station: 10am-3pm, (10-minute walk along Bridlington St)

See the photograph display, details about the North Eastern Railway Tile Map, partake of the harvest giveaway. Produce donated by Hunmanby Allotments, local households and Hunmanby Free Fridge. Where any remaining produce will be given after the event.

White Swan Inn, 1 Church Hill

Photographs from 40 years of being a steeplejack 1975-2016 2pm to 4pm

A photographic display by Jack Howley on his life as a Steeplejack in Britain and Europe. Jack Howley from Dewsbury, worked for over 40 years as a Steeplejack from 1975 to 2016. He is putting on display for the first time his personal photographs that show the changes in our landscape. In the 70s the chimneys were mostly brick and stone, when he finished most, he worked on were of concrete and steel, the structure had got larger, and many were the more modern multi flair.

Jack will be able to explain what life was like being an 'old school' steeplejack. How you put up and secured your Yorkshire Ladders, Lancashire Ladders or Aluminium Skids.

Filey Bay 1779 Pop up Exhibition.

The Battle of Flamborough Head, one of the most celebrated naval actions in US history, took place during the American Revolution in 1779 off the Yorkshire Coast. Find out how Hunmanby played an active role in the battle and its aftermath!

Hunmanby Crown Green Bowling Club, Sands Lane Y014 0LT 1pm to 3pm

A History of Four Decades of Bowling.

An exhibition by Hunmanby Crown Green Bowling Club showing the history of this community owned and run Crown Green Bowling Club. Hunmanby Crown Green Bowling Club was formed in 1982. The exhibition is a tribute to the people who first built a Crown Green at The Railway Tavern, then purchased land to build the current Crown Green and Club House. Rebuilt twice, it is now a great community asset, used by groups from the Allotments Association to Hunmanby & District Careers and Cared for Group. Come and try Crown Green Bowling with a 'Drakes Pride' bowl, in honour of Sir Francis Drake and the quote attributed on 29th July 1588 'Time enough to play the game and thrash the Spaniards afterwards'. There are plenty of benches at the Crown Green Bowling Club, surrounded by flowers, planted and maintained by club members, a nice place to relax and watch a game of bowls.
